We had a very exciting ACPA convention in Las Vegas a few weeks ago and CAL accomplished a lot in setting strategic goals for next year. Among goals we discussed are:

Revisiting our guiding principles. CAL originally established our guiding principles almost 10 years ago – and we believe it is time to revisit them in light of the new strategic direction ACPA is taking to ensure we align our principles with ACPA. Please let me know if you are interested in being involved in this initiative.

• **Sponsored Programs**. CAL sponsors a strong repertoire of programs each year at the annual conference – and this year we want to take the programs a step further by partnering with the presenters to present a webinar on the material and perhaps an article or two for developments.

• **Partnerships with Other Commissions**. CAL continues to look for opportunities to partner with other commissions to present professional development relevant to higher education administrators. We are currently working with both the Commission for Assessment on potential programming and the Task Force for Alumni Relations and Development on a program regarding the need to raise awareness of how student affairs folks contribute directly and indirectly to institutional alumni relationship building and fundraising efforts.

• **Retention White Paper.** We continue our discussion and development of a white paper on retention in light of Complete College America initiative targeted at requiring states to establish a state commitment to a specific number of college graduates by a certain date. Within in this process, states are required to define success in terms of college graduation, hold stakeholders accountable, and create a shared responsibility in educating and graduating the state's citizens and future leaders.
