Mentor a Graduate Student or New Professional

As you may know, last year ACPA launched a new program, called saGROW and we want to make you aware of it so that you can consider participating in the second cohort that is currently being organized.

This program pairs a graduate student and/or new professional (protégé) with a more seasoned midlevel manager or Senior Student Affairs Officer-SSAO (mentor), who will meet primarily or exclusively by phone, Skype, or other electronic methods. The program is intended to create a mentor/protégé relationship by providing weekly suggested topics for conversation between mentors and their protégés on career-related topics such as networking, navigating institutional politics, career advancement, current issues in the profession of student affairs and/or topics that may be of timely interest to the protégé and/or mentor. The topics will simply be a suggestion for discussion, as they are designed to provide a guide for your conversations. The suggested time commitment is about 30 minutes a week, but pairs can determine what works best for them.

While the timeframe is a two-month commitment, including an opportunity to meet at the ACPA convention, saGROW encourages mentor/ protégé pairs to consider extending their relationship if mutually decided. The program is open to all levels of graduate students and professionals looking to connect and share their experiences as a mentor, a protégé, or both.

As we are working to recruit our second cohort of mentors and protégés, we are especially interested in your involvement as a mentor. There are many professionals who would benefit from your experience. We know it can be difficult to mentor professionals on one's own campus, so this is an opportunity to make new connections and help give back to our field.
