It is with great pride that the Standing Committees for Women, Men, and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Awareness announce our support for Dr. Elisa Abesõ campaign as an ACPA Diamond Honoree. This year, we have nominated Dr. Elisa Abes as one of thirteen Diamond Honorees who we hope will be inducted into this prestigious group of educators. We're asking you to consider supporting this nomination financially so she may become a part of the ACPA legacy.

The Diamond Honoree Program, established by the ACPA Foundation in 1999, is both a recognition program and a fund raising activity. Those nominated for consideration are recognized for their outstanding and sustained contributions to higher education and to student affairs. The Honorees were nominated by colleagues who believe these individuals have distinguished themselves as teachers, administrators, researchers, writers, and association leaders.
