Without a doubt, Dr. David Drum is one of the most respected and well-known icons among counseling center directors and the larger mental health community. Dr. Drum received his Ph.D. from American University in 1969 and was director of counseling centers at The University of Rhode Island and The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga before coming to Texas. Last year, after 28 years as Associate Vice President for Student Affairs and Director of Counseling, Learning and Career Services at The University of Texas, he moved into the role of Professor of Educational Psychology in the Department of Educational Psychology at UT.
